Thanks for writing! You're right to identify an irony in the situation: I showed you interfaces that are supposedly preoccupied with new modes of visibility, and yet they are nowhere "online" to be found. There were a few book/reading projects I discussed at BOM:

— you're probably thinking of my PDF reader experiment (aka "looseleaf," aka "BOOKS WITHOUT COVERS"). An [early sketch](#), operating on the [Vasulka PDF Archive](#), demonstrates some of its strengths (as well as weaknesses) on a heterogeneous archive. I've made a few tweaks to the UI since then, and also have a simpler version for [scrubbing through PDFs](#) individually, which you can play with [here](#).
